


The Division, Decline and Captivity of the once great kingdom of Israel

#### **Message of Kings**

- Covenant failure of the nation & its kings
- ☆Introduction of idolatry & assimilation of God's covenant people with condemned culture of pagan nations around them
- Supremacy of the LORD over Baal, other Canaanite deities and their prophets.
- ☆The Lord's rule over Israel demonstrated by His guidance of Israel's history thru His prophets when kings & priests fail, over 30% of Kings is about the prophets.

So give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong. For who is able to govern this great people of yours?" (3:7–9).

### Division of the Kingdom, 1 Kings 12-16

Rehoboam's Folly (1 Kings 12:1-15)

Israel's revolt/secession (1 Kings 12:16-20

Came as fulfillment of the prophetic word So the king did not listen to the people, for this turn of events was from the LORD, to fulfill the word the LORD had spoken to Jeroboam son of Nebat through Ahijah the Shilonite. When all Israel saw that the king refused to listen to them, they answered the king: "What share do we have in David, what part in Jesse's son? To your tents, O Israel! Look after your own house, O David!" So the Israelites went home.

# Division of the Kingdom, 12-16 War averted thru the prophetic word

The word of the LORD came to Shemaiah the man of God,"This is what the LORD says: Do not go up to fight against your brothers, the Israelites. Go home, every one of you, for this is my doing." So they obeyed the word of the LORD and went home again, as the LORD had ordered.

(12:22-24)

#### Division of the Kingdom, 12-16

Jeroboam introduces idolatry and apostasy in Israel (12:25-33)

"Which he had devised in his own heart"

- New capital city at Shechem
- New worship centers on the borders
- New object of worship = the golden calves
- New priesthood & high places for worship
- New feast replacing the Passover

A God given opportunity for good is lost & seeds of Israel's destruction are sown!

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## Seeds of Israel's destruction are sown! "For the message he declared by the word of the LORD against the altar in Bethel and against all the shrines on the high places in the towns of Samaria will certainly come true." Even after this, Jeroboam did not change his evil ways, but once more appointed priests for the high places from all sorts of people. Anyone who wanted to become a priest he consecrated for the high places. This was the sin of the house of Jeroboam that led to its downfall and to its destruction from the face of the earth.(13:32-34) Seeds of Judah's destruction also sown! places, with male cult prostitutes, like the Canaanites before them (14:22-24) plunders the temple treasures (14:25-28) Rehoboam's death follows a seventeen year war with Jeroboam (14:29-31) (Solomon's shields of gold replaced by Rehoboam's shields of brass!!) Abijam continues the same sins, but is not judged "for David's sake" (15:1-8). (Note the "except" clause re David!!) Kings of Israel and Judah (12-16) Kings of Israel Kings of Judah 1. Rehoboam Jeroboam 2. Abijah Nadab\* 3. Asa Baasha Elah\* Zimri\* Omri Note the difference in the number & length of reigns! Ahab Kings assassinated \* Asa of Judah (15) 1. Asa: He did what was right as David did, though not fully. As abegan well but finished badly! (15:9-15; 2 Chr. 14-16) 2. But, Asa's alliance with Ben-Hadad of Damascus against Baasha of Israel sealed with the silver and gold that were left in the treasuries of the temple! (15:16-22). 3. Asa's death leaves his son Jehoshaphat on the throne (1 Kings 15:23-24). Revivals in Judah bring some relief!

## Ahab and Elijah the Prophet (17-22) Ahab followed Jeroboam's evil policies, married Jezebel, the daughter of the king of Sidon, began to follow Baal (16:29-33a). Ahab provoked the LORD more than all who were before him (16:33). Drought comes at Elijah's word, (3 years) Elijah confronts Ahab and the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel, prophets of Baal are defeated and destroyed demonstrating that the LORD is God (17-18) **Elijah- His Ministry and Miracles** Called for a drought, lasted 3 years (17) Miraculously fed by ravens (17) Widow's oil maintained, son raised (17) Calls down fire on Mt. Carmel (18) Orders death of prophets of Baal (18) Anoints, Hazael, Jehu, and Elisha (19) Announces death of Ahab & Jezebel (21) Caught up alive to heaven (2 Kings 1-2) Ahab's Notoriety! There was never anyone like Ahab, who sold himself to do evil in the eyes of the LORD, urged on by Jezebel his wife. He behaved in the vilest manner by going after idols, like the Amorites the LORD drove out before Israel. (21:25-29) Ahab's Reprieve! The word of the LORD to Elijah, "because he has humbled himself, I will not bring this disaster in his day, but I will bring it on his house in the days of his son." See you next week!
