# At Home Study Guide

For the week of January 23, 2022

*It can often be helpful to zoom out on an image to get the big picture. We want to help you to know God's Word better this month by giving you *The Big Picture*, a view of the whole story of God's Word, from Eden to Eternity. Over the five Sundays in January we will cover God's promises made in the Old Testament, and God's promises kept in the New Testament, in order to help you grow in your knowledge of God and his Word.*

1. The phrase Jesus, *Son of David* describes so much more than the human king the Jews were looking for (Matt. 21:9). What spiritual enemies do you need Jesus to defeat in your life?
2. *Son of Man* describes Jesus' authority over the universe in everything in it. Why is it important that this man Jesus came as a suffering servant (Mark 10:45)?
3. The first Adam failed in the garden by giving in to sin. Jesus, the true *Son of Adam*, conquered sin and death. Read Romans 5:14 and 1 Corinthians 15:22, 45 and think about what difference that makes in your life.
4. God had a plan from eternity to past to send Jesus, the *Son of God*, to earth. Read John 20:30-31 and consider why God led John to write his gospel for you.
