The story of Joseph is familiar to many of us. We have heard of his amazing technicolor coat and the incredible events of his life. How did the story of Joseph encourage the original hearers, and how does it point us towards Jesus, so that we live differently as a result? Join with us as we work through the final chapters of Genesis, the book of beginnings, to see how God works in broken people.

1. It was about eleven years between the time that Joseph was sold by his brothers and when Joseph interpreted the dreams of these two men. Put yourself in Joseph's shoes and think about your state of mind after eleven years. Consider verses 14-15 as you think about Joseph.
2. What do you notice about Joseph's character in verses 5-8? How does his situation impact how he acts?
3. Heb. 12:2-3 points us to Jesus, who suffered more than Joseph ever did. How does Jesus' suffering help us to understand the purpose of suffering and what Jesus suffered to provide for us?
