James 3:13-18

*This fall we will consider the book of James and its application to us today. As you study the passage, look beyond your notes to glean more truth from this passage by using these questions, so that you know God better!*

**Context:** How does the theme of this passage connect with what immediately precedes and follows?

**Observation:** Notice the indications of lack of wisdom, and the indicators of true wisdom. In what ways do these descriptions help you understand wisdom?

**Meaning:** Wisdom demonstrates itself in our actions. According to James, what is the root of a lack of wisdom? Why do these particular traits show wisdom?

**Application:** Just as James did in chapter 1, he emphasizes wisdom here. In what areas do you need to grow to gain in biblical wisdom? In what areas do you need to confess sin?
